

Beethoven no end & Brahms piano concerti


After the traditional Viennese New Year concerts in both Cairo & Alexandria, CSO starts 2018 by music that satisfies various tastes: It shares in common Beethoven works and concludes Brahms symphonies cycle by his monumental piano concerti.

Lalo and Richard Strauss

CSO is delighted to invite the Austrian wunderkind **Nadine Weber** to perform the delightful Symphonie Espagnole, where Lalo like Bizet in Carmen, follows a period when Spanishthemed music came into vogue. It will be preceded by Beethoven overture "The Consecration of the House" that bears the influence of Bach and Handel especially in its famous trumpet fanfare used by the Egyptian TV series in the seventies.

A perfect conclusion is the challenging tone poem Don Quixote by Richard Strauss featuring cellist **Kamel Salah Eldin** under the baton of conductor **Nader Abbassi**.

Based on Cervantes popular novel, it was entitled by the composer "Fantastic Variations on a Theme of Knightly Character".

Brahms Piano Concerti (I)

The first concert featuring Brahms piano concertos on the 20th starts by Mozart overture to his last opera that combines comedy, farce, romance, fairy tale, Egyptian mythology, and Masonic elements: The Magic Flute.

Brahms original plan was to compose a symphony but ended up with his first piano

concerto Op. 15 which will be performed by **Mohamed Shams Eldin.**

Maestro Ahmed El Saedi is a great expert of Beethoven and will conduct his 5th Symphony, one of the best-known compositions in classical music, and one of the most frequently played in the whole repertoire.

The World of Crossover (III)

Join the CSO for an intimate evening of movies music on the 27th in the third of a series of crossover music. The orchestra will offer a fresh look on favorite Hollywood hits under conductor **Ahmed Atef**.

As the 20th century approached, a new art form was developed, one that would go on to dominate the next hundred years. Though cinema began in silence, it guickly acquired sound and attracted musicians and composers. The new medium demanded a new approach, both aesthetically and technologically, but these problems were overcome remarkably quickly, allowing film composition to develop into a sophisticated branch of music-drama.

Many major classical composers tackled successfully this new genre: Erich Korngold, Virgil Thomson, Aaron Copland, Leonard Bernstein, Malcolm Arnold, William Walton, Arthur Bliss, Ralph Vaughan Williams, Hugo Alfvén,

Miklós Rózsa, Dmitry Shostakovich, Sergey Prokofiev, Arthur Honegger, Jacques Ibert, Georges Auric, Toru Takemitsu etc..
