Despite his short lifetime, Schubert left behind a vast oeuvre, including Overture in C "In the Italian Style" to be performed on the 2nd.

Extraordinary virtuosity on the instrument especially the concerto based on themes from Donizetti "La Favorita"

The final will be with Tchaikovsky Suite Caractéristique, the second of his four orchestral suites, and one of his least frequently performed works in concert halls, maybe because the work comprises a series of almost balletic character pieces!
