# Bruch & Nielsen premieres, Beethoven's night, Rossini 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary, New Year.

December is always rich in musical events to celebrate the whole holiday's season. This month includes romantic, Nordic, Christmas Concerts along with a Beethoven evening and the traditional New Year gala.

### **Romantic Affairs**

This unique event includes Brahms "ironic" Academic Festival overture and is conducted by the promising **Ahmed Farag**.

Max Bruch's first violin concerto has become a staple of the fiddle

repertoire. His delightful double piano concerto Egyptian premiere is introduced by **Ghada Shaker,** and **Amany Mounir** 

Mendelssohn epic 2nd symphony, Lobgesang (Hymn of Praise) was composed, to mark the 400th anniversary of the printing press by Gutenberg. The soloists are Soprano Mona Rafla, Soprano Iman Moustafa, and Tenor Hisham El Guindy accompanied by A Cappella choir under Choir Master May Gvineria.

## Voices from the North

Carl Nielsen is recognized as Denmark's great composer. In cooperation with the Danish embassy, the concert of all Egyptian premiere on the 8<sup>th</sup> follows the cycle of Nielsen major works such as the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> symphonies, Clarinet concerto etc.. Soprano Julie Meera Albersten will introduce the 5 poems by J.P. Jacobsen and Mina Ghobrial will interpret one of the major flute concertos in the whole repertoire under conductor Peter Ettrup Larsen.



The perfect conclusion is the 3rd symphony whose power and vitality of the music took even Nielsen by surprise when he directed the rehearsals for the first performance in 1911.

# An Evening with Beethoven



Antonio di Cristofano
Is performing Beethoven Emperor concerto, on the 15<sup>th</sup>

Few works by great composers are as famously infamous as Beethoven's Wellington's Victory, a commissioned piece for a jubilee occasion..

On the other hand, Piano Concerto No. 5 known for its grandeur, bold melodies, and heroic spirit, remains the best known and most frequently performed of Beethoven's concerti. **Antonio di Cristofano** is the ultimate virtuoso.

Music director Ahmed El Saedi concludes the evening by the third symphony "Eroica", a pillar grounded in the Classical symphonic tradition by stretching boundaries of form, length, harmony, and perceived emotional and even cultural content.

### Petite Messe Solenelle: A Rossini Christmas on the 22<sup>nd</sup>

Gioachino Rossini was the greatest Italian composer of his time. In the first half of his life he was astonishingly prolific, and composed nearly forty operas by the age of 38. Of those many are key to the repertories of modern opera companies around the world.

On the 22<sup>nd</sup>, Cairo Symphony orchestra, in cooperation with the Italian Cultural Institute, celebrates his 150<sup>th</sup> death anniversary with his instrumental Introduction, Theme and Variations for Clarinet and Orchestra followed by his sacred work, Petite Messe Solenelle.


The variations, based on two of Rossini's most moving dramatic arias, remain among the most popular virtuosic works for clarinet to this day & will be interpreted by veteran clarinetist

Mohamed Hamdy.

Full of drama, pathos, colour and intensity, Rossini's Petite Messe was originally written two pianos and a French harmonium. This heartfelt religious work was Rossini's last serious work—with it he sincerely hoped to gain admittance to the next world—and shows the extraordinary capabilities of this astonishing man of the theatre. The sheer variety of movements is extraordinary, ranging from a desolate 'Crucifixus', ecstatic solos, sublime duets and dramatic trios, a hair-raising 'Et resurrexit', as powerful an 'Agnus Dei' as any of the era, through to two examples of the form of which Rossini was the undisputed master, the fugue: both are utterly compelling.

The soloists on the 22<sup>nd</sup> are Russian Dina Iskander, Alto Jolie Faizy, Tenor Hany El Safie and Bass Reda El Wakil accompanied by A Cappella choir under Choir Master May Gvineria.
Guest Conductor Roberto Molinelli will conduct this unique Christmas Concert.

The music always includes pieces from the Strauss family—Johann Strauss I, Johann Strauss II, Josef Strauss and Eduard Strauss—with occasional additional music from other mainly Austrian composers, including Joseph Lanner, Otto Nicolai, Franz Lehar, Franz von Suppé, Emmerich Kálmán and Robert Stolz.
